Our teams performed well and on many occasions were up with the placegetters and in the final 8 teams. Great to see our juniors in the under 14 section taking part and seeing them compete at the same track and same venue as the masters who had a fabulous successful weekend.

Country Titles

We headed back to Dubbo, and what a great weekend. We performed really well on the track and the friendship and loyalty to our club really shines at this very successful and enjoyable three-day meet. Timetabling, in many cases, was not the best and we hope that ANSW takes note of this come

Equipment Report

Equipment for our club will change a little for the coming up season 2023/2034, due to Beaton Park Management taking over the running of school carnivals and thus taking back some of the equipment they purchased. This means such items such as our trolley has now been replaced with a new one with Blue Stars and Athletics Wollongong going halves in this item.

During the 2022/23 season we have seen the implementation of:

- a. Digital timing on computer but are now gearing up to align this with the starting gun.
- b. The club has purchased new shots, discuses and hammers and javelins to add to our ageing field equipment. The new hammers will be aligned to new handles and swivels.
- c. The club no longer has to rely on handguns with caps but have retained these with a few boxes of caps in case of emergency.
- d. Back up stop watches are also being retained and are used at club meets, along with the digital timing.

It will be interesting to see how Beaton Park Management goes with the running and placement of equipment for school carnivals and we have already seen a number of issues that have impacted on our club and other clubs such as space etc. Many of the items now being used are really items that were purchased through funding from the carnivals such as witches' caps etc, minor but required items.

Our starting blocks seriously need attention and if our region is to conduct Country along with the Track Challenge, this is an item that we seriously need to look at. We have obtained a quote and by going halves with Athletics Wollongong, the ten sets required would cost both clubs the sum of \$1,500, but it is the cost of the trolley that is required for the new blocks that is costly. We can no longer rely on Beaton Park Management for such cost but if they continue to use our blocks for schools and they do deteriorate more, we will have an argument on helping to replace them with new ones.

We are also expecting the rest of our stock for field equipment to come very soon for us to have in season 2023/2024.


